

# COBBLES CAFE

## MINISTRY VISION/PURPOSE:

To provide a place for people to experience God's grace through a warm welcome, friendly service, Fair Trade coffee and tea and homemade cakes at an affordable price in an attractive environment, the offer of company for people on their own, a sympathetic ear, sharing faith (when appropriate), the opportunity to pray with or for someone, the promotion of church activities.

## ROLE:

To run Cobbles café in the Guild House on Saturday mornings.  
To welcome and reach out to everyone who comes into Cobbles.  
To care for one another (both volunteers and customers).  
To give people an opportunity to begin a faith journey.  
To give volunteers an opportunity to grow in discipleship.



## WHAT ROLE INVOLVES:

Saturday morning team roles include: team leader; people to set up, including tables, cakes, etc., meet and greet guests, serve drinks and cakes, take payments, prepare drinks, be waiters, clear trays, wash and dry crockery and cutlery, clear away at the end of the morning.

Cake bakers' role: making cakes and tray bakes for Saturdays.

Other core team roles include: cake manager; rota manager; finance manager; purchasing manager; faith leader.

There are monthly rotas for the Saturday teams and the bakers.
