



How much can I give?

Our giving to God is personal and private. We all currently give different amounts each week or month to KPC. As a guide, and it is only that, we have prepared the table below showing some suggested amounts you might pledge, in addition to your regular giving, *For future generations*.

As an example, for somebody who gives **£1,200** each year (£100 each month) through regular giving:

Over 3 years, could you pledge to give an additional **£5,800** through one-off giving and/or adding to your regular monthly giving?

Amount you give regularly each year	Your pledge For future generations (over 3 years)	Total (including 25% Gift Aid)
Up to £200	£500	£625
£200 to £300	£1,200	£1,500
£300 to £500	£1,900	£2,375
£500 to £1000	£3,300	£4,125
£1000 to £1500	£5,800	£7,250
£1500 to £2000	£8,500	£10,625
£2000 to £5000	£14,500	£18,125
More than £5000	£42,000	£52,500

If you are able to tick the Gift Aid box on the Pledge Form, KPC will be able to claim an additional 25%

If we all individually pledge in line with where our own regular giving is in this table, we will achieve the funding we need from the Church Family to deliver the *For future generations* project.



Gift Aid Guidance

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For every **£100** that you give to the Church, the tax man is willing to give another **£25** from the tax you have already paid.

'Gift Aiding' your donation is a real help to our fund-raising challenge, but some of the rules can seem a bit confusing!

So, what are the rules to Gift Aiding?

You must be a UK taxpayer. KPC can't claim more Gift Aid than you have paid in Income or Capital Gains Tax. Donations for *For future generations* are likely to be larger than the everyday sponsored bike ride so following the Gift Aid rules is important. To check that you have paid enough tax for full Gift Aid to be claimed, please complete our:

Gift Aid Checker

My donations of £ ÷ 4 = £

(include all charitable donations in the tax year, not just to KPC)

Annual tax that you pay £

(From your P60 or pay statements)

If the Annual Tax that you pay **GREEN BOX** is more than the amount in the **BLUE BOX** see A below. If not, see B below:

A

I pay enough tax for KPC to claim full Gift Aid. What do I do now?

Nothing - KPC can claim full Gift Aid through your existing declaration

If you don't already have a Gift Aid Declaration, please contact the Church Office

B

I don't pay enough tax for the size of my donation

Spread your donation over 2 or 3 years to ensure KPC is able to claim the full Gift Aid

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Here are a few more questions and answers that may help you

I don't pay any tax as my income is less than £12,570 per year. Can I claim Gift Aid?

Unfortunately you can't but your donation is still really important to us

Don't tick the Gift Aid box on the pledge form

I paid a lot of tax last year but won't be paying any this year. How can KPC receive Gift Aid

The tax man allows you to 'carry back' a claim for Gift Aid to the previous tax year

As long as you have not submitted your 2024/25 tax return, yet you can claim 2025/26 giving against 2024/25

I pay 40% tax. Does this mean the church receives more Gift Aid?

No, KPC can only claim 25% Gift Aid from HMRC. However, higher rate tax payers are entitled to a tax rebate

You can claim the rebate using your self assessment form or by contacting HMRC. Perhaps you can donate more as a result
