1. What struck you most from the sermon?
2. What strikes you most from the two passages?
3. What other examples can you think of in the Bible where Jesus 'draws out' or calls forth something new?
4. When you hear the phrase 'the treasure of the church', what do you think of?
5. How can we practically 'draw out' (i.e., encourage) the treasure within one another?
6. How can we live in the tension between the old and the new as Christians, i.e., we are members of a 2,000 year old faith and yet God is always doing a new thing?
7. What 'water into wine' miracles are you hoping for? What new thing would you love to see emerging?
8. What do we do in times when the wine has run out (so to speak 😊)?
9. As we emerge from this pandemic and hopefully go back to a semblance of normality, in what ways do you want to go back to how things were and in what ways do you not want to? (Thinking personally and in terms of church)
